DAPHNE LUTES STORY

Learning that your mom needs to travel from The Pas to Winnipeg for cancer treatment is stressful enough, but finding this out when you live 2000 km away is unbearable.

"It's hard enough to know your mom has to go through cancer but right away I started thinking about how I would afford to stay in Winnipeg while she was getting treatment."

The cost of a hotel each night was a daunting thought for Shelley, who lives in Kamloops, BC. When her mom, Daphne, was told about A Port in the Storm, her experience became more bearable for both mother and daughter.

Daphne arrived at A Port in the Storm on a Wednesday and Shelley arrived the following Sunday.

"My first impression was that it was just a wonderful facility and so needed," says Shelley. "And the fact that I

could stay with mom made all the difference in the world." Shelley raves about the staff and volunteers, especially Cecile, our extra special volunteer.

"My mom doesn't drink coffee and one night I just felt like a cup of coffee. Cecile went above and beyond and brought me coffee. Little things like that make such a big difference when you're going through a stressful time."

Both Shelley and her mom got to know the other families staying at A Port in the Storm and attribute this extended support system to Daphne's recovery. Not having to worry about the financial stress of paying for a hotel meant that Shelley could truly focus on her mom and helping her go through treatment.

"I have no idea what we would have done without *A Port in the Storm*," Shelley says. "If I could describe the place in two words it would be overwhelmingly caring." While she hopes she never has to come back, she wants other families to know that it's truly a wonderful place. "I have nothing but good things to say about this place."

WE'RE ON THE MOVE!

A Port in the Storm has officially moved into our new home at 311 Alexander Avenue in the heart of Winnipeg's historic Exchange District.

Over the past few months, our staff members and volunteers have been helping guests transition to their new suites. There have been a few hiccups along the way but we're all working hard to iron out the kinks. We know that when we all work together, great things happen!

WHY DID WE MOVE?

Our contract to stay at Villa Aulneau expired on March 31, 2016. They had been kind enough to extend this contract several times but it was time for us to find our own home. This move gives us better footing as a non-profit organization and will help us provide affordable accommodations for more families.

We are closer to Health Sciences Centre and centrally located so it will be easy to access other hospitals and all parts of Winnipeg.

WHAT HASN'T CHANGED?

A Port in the Storm is still a place to call home. The same warm, caring atmosphere that our guests have come to expect will simply move to a new location. Our rates will not change and our mission is the same.

Guests can find restaurants, shopping, a playground, and other attractions all within walking distance. All of the suites have been renovated and offer the same comforts of home including full kitchens, TV, phone and internet, on-site laundry and free parking.


